



This, along with many seemingly out of character actions by Mrs. Savage, are what prompted her stepchildren to place her in an institution. They are a sweet and caring group of people, who like the safety and security that the Cloisters provides. They each begin to care deeply for Mrs. Savage, and quickly welcome her into their little family. Mrs. Savage in turn learns to love their little quirks. After placing their stepmother in the care of the Cloisters, the three Savage children expect to have the fortune placed under their control, but they are

sorely disappointed. Mrs. Savage has hidden all the money somewhere and will not relinquish it. She sends each one of her stepchildren on a little trip to find the stash, on which they make fools of themselves. Mrs. Savage is now free to go wherever she would like, so the residents say their goodbyes, with their own, personal "I Love You" to part. But then Mrs. Savage realizes she doesn't want to go at all. The Doctor who has overseen her case convinces her that she doesn't belong at the Cloisters; she doesn't need to be sheltered like the rest, so she decides to leave after all. Ms. Willie brings her things, along with an envelope; inside the envelope is all of Mrs. Savage's money! Ms. Willie tells her that she took it when the lights went out, and just burnt up some newspaper in the bucket. Mrs. Savage departs, and the scene ends with a view of how each resident Mrs. Savage has grown to love, sees themselves in their sheltered life.


March 29th Palm Sunday
