

Many shared their stories of outreach and giving and how they witnessed the positive effects that even a small group can have. It would be nice to have even more next time, so we will keep you posted on our next event and in the meanwhile, save any of your sample size items for the homeless ... it will be much appreciated. decorated in a St. Patrick's Day theme. The evening started with an ice breaker quiz. We learned some interesting things about each other! There was much fun and laughter as we split up into groups and played a variety of different games. (Steve Williams plays a mean game of Jenga!) An abundance of yummy snacks were enjoyed throughout the evening, including popcorn, cracker jacks, shamrock sugar cookies and more. Reported by Todd Moses: Bethany Moses has had a year filled with musical performances. In November, she earned a perfect score for her 2 solos at MSVMA's Musical Theater Solo & Ensemble. Over the winter months she earned high ratings at MSVMA (vocal) & MSBOA (instrumental) district solo & ensembles, placing her in the state level for both. For vocal S&E, she performed both as a soloist and in 2 different ensembles. For instrumental, she performed in a wind quintet. Along with S&E activities, she landed a spot in the Chippewa District Idol Competition and wowed the audience with a theatrical piece called "Astonishing." Over all of these experiences, Bethany was in daily rehearsals with West Side Story, which she portrayed the leading role of Maria, opposite her boyfriend, Jake, who played Tony. The musical production had a fabulous 5 show run, bringing the audience to tears and a standing ovation each night. Shortly after West Side Story completed, State S&E festivals took place. She received first division rating in all events, both MSVMA & MSBOA. Her woodwind quintet scored so

well that it was a finalist for the state to perform at the Michigan Youth Arts Festival.

Throughout the year, Bethany also was involved with MSVMA's Honors Choir. In the fall, she auditioned for the Regional level and was assigned 2 solos within the Regional Choir. She progressed to the State Honors Choir, which performed at the Michigan Music Conference in Grand Rapids in January. A month later she found out that she was selected for the most prestigious level, the All-State Honors Choir, which performed at WMU this spring at MYAF. At this level, it is the top 114 singers from the entire state. Within this level, there was one soprano solo in the literature and Bethany was selected to receive the solo!

Most recently, Bethany was nominated for the Ovation Awards in Michigan from her performance of Maria in West Side Story. From this nomination, she has been selected to compete later in May at Michigan State University for the Ovation Award for Best Performance by an Actress. The winner of the Ovation Award progresses to the national level to compete in New York City for the Jimmy Award.
